"BRING-IN –Building professional capacity to combat discrimination against and better meet the needs of Intersex Persons" project is a 2-year ground-breaking initiative that aims at enhancing the visibility of Intersex People and promoting Intersex Equality in Greece, Hungary, UK and Bulgaria by building the capacity of social and healthcare professionals on how to recognize, prevent and combat discrimination on the grounds of sex characteristics, while raising public awareness and advocating for the need to act upon the human rights violations that intersex people face.
